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


Denver Youth and Libraries Project

Each year, the Denver Public Library engages in a Service Planning process to identify which programs or targeted services should be offered at which frequency at all 27 locations.

There were a few key questions to solve for:

- How can we compile the breadth of available data on Denver youth and the Denver Public library in one space?
- What does a shared understanding of how decisions are made look like?
- How can we reliably maintain this data and ensure it's available when we need it?




Evolution of the Project


- Expanding into a GIS Dashboard to include even more data points across age ranges and demographics categories and **allow for all departments to have access to the same information for decision making.**
- Utilizing open and publicly available data sources allows us to report both our usage metrics and decision making to other City agencies in **one easy to navigate tool.**
- These tools have been shared with and modified in collaboration with Denver Public Schools and the Office of Children's Affairs to **ensure alignment in the decision making information we have across the City.**
- These tools are **a continual work-in-progress** to ensure they maintain utility and relevance to our internal and external partners.

Public libraries have so much to offer beyond just books!

Free access to many, many, many databases

- Tutor.com: Offers free homework assistance for students.
- Data Axle: Provides comprehensive business and residential directories.
- SimplyAnalytics: Allows for mapping, analytics, and data visualization, featuring over 100,000 data variables.

Library of Things

- Access to diverse resources such as sewing machines, WiFi hotspots, and Power Check Meters, and Cultural Passes that allow for free visits to local museums, zoos, and Colorado State Parks.
